

That weekend in 1792, the settlers of New Salem gathered for their first organizational meeting as the Seventh Day Baptist Church of New Salem. They organized the first government and enacted measures to deal with conflict. Additionally, that is the same time 69 years latter that McClellan marched his soldiers through New Salem on his way to the first land battle of the Civil War. The Convention on Statehood started on that day and we will be coordinating our Civil War Program with the Harrison County Program at the Veteran's Park.
