21st Annual Dulcimer

Fort New Salem comes alive with the sounds of dulcimers on August 12—14. The weekend features hands-on music workshops during the day for all levels of players. The workshops focus primarily on the mountain and hammered dulcimer with additional ones on other folk instruments. Musicians from Ohio, West Virginia and beyond lead the teaching. Workshop application are available on our web. Daily general admission for visitors is \$3.

There will be concerts on Friday and Saturday. The Friday concert is a "coffee house" style concert introducing several of the workshop leaders. The coffee house concert is included in the general admission. The Saturday evening Front Porch Concert features Bill Collins on mountain dulcimer and Adam Sutch on hammered dulcimer has an additional admission of \$ 3.

Vendors will be available throughout the weekend to sell dulcimers and supplies. There will also be books and CDs available from many of the workshop leaders. Additionally our gift shop will feature gifts & crafts.
